



NO WIND TODAY

Second day of the World Masters Championship unfortunately went without sailing.

Day passed in waiting, even on water, for the start of the third race till late afternoon when it was obvious there won't any completed regatta today.

Due to lack of wind, the fleet of 167 sailors from 25 countries stayed on shore today till 14:00. Race Committee was trying to find the area with most wind but even than all could be found was 3 to 7 knots west of island Čiovo.

Race course was set in area named Charlie and at 15:55 with steady 6 knots of west-ern wind Red group start was sounded and fifteen minutes later same with Blue group. Groups slowly sailed and turned leeward buoy and got to sail part of downwind part when N flag was displayed and race was abandoned!

-Today we didn't have luck with wind, we tried to finish one race however there wasn't enough wind for it. There is no cause for panic yet since tomorrow is a new day and start is planned for 13:00 – we were told by the IRO Alen Kustić upon return from water.

On Wednesday the Annual General Meeting will be held at the Club. Meeting is scheduled for 10:00.

LUKŠA CICARELLI WON FIRST RACE



World Finn Masters Championship 2010, organized by the YC Labud, had an excellent start. First race, in his red group, won a local sailor Lukša Cicarelli while Michael Maier, from Czech Republic, did the same in the other, blue, group.

The fleet headed out to race after 10 o'clock due to start scheduled for 12:00, however due to wind conditions, president of the Race Committee, Alen Kustić postponed the first start for an hour. First start was given at 13:00 for first and fifteen minutes later and second group. Fleet is consisting of 167 sailors from 25 countries and is divided into two groups: Red (84 sailors) and Blue (83 sailors)

ITALIAN LEEDS IN FRONT OF MAIER

- We set the course in sailing area Alpha, in front of Sustipan toward Čiovo in western wind (maestral) that shifted back and forth from 8 to 12 knots, and we even had general recall in the first group start. Victory in that first race went to Lukša who owns many titles and medals from the past championships and in the other group to Maier, while in the second race of the day Lukša had a little less luck – events on water were commented by Denis Marinov, RC member also stating that in 2nd race in blue group winner was Marco Buglielli, making the Italian top sailor the championship in front of Maier.

SAVING THE FRENCH

As far as 2nd race for the Red group, another well known name, Peter Mosny (Slovakia) won. Peter, other than Finn sailing, is also renowned skipper of the Quebramark.

There were unpredicted events on water such as when a French sailor that fell in water and didn't have strength to return to his Finn until he was assisted by Željko Katunarić who jumped into his boat and helped the sailor return to sail. During the assistance Kanta had misfortune when he got hurt himself. Luckily it wasn't anything serious.

OFFICIAL DINNER

Even though participants of this regatta claim that results are not so important these experienced sailors still like to show their skills on water and on land. That was evident even upon fleet's return to harbor after 17:00 when about thirty sailors arrived at the plateau at the same time and tried to get their boats out on land as soon as possible and thus creating a short line.

Tomorrow first start is scheduled for the 12:00 and, weather permitting, two races will be sailed. Meanwhile organizers of this prestigious regatta are planning an official dinner for all participants. Venue is set at restaurant Grašo, above the club, starting at 20:00.

PARTICIPANTS INCLUDE 75 YEAR OLDS AND THREE WOMEN



As far as ceremonial opening of the World Finn Masters Championship 2010, held at Labud's plateau Sunday evening, once again it was shown why this regatta holds title - prestigious. Annual gathering of the best sailors that, for decades have competed in and won numerous world and Olympic regattas, even in their formative years still feel the need to race is this year is held in Split, Croatia.

Finn masters president Fons van Gent, has told us that it is his honor to be in Split once again and welcome masters among which there are two 75 year old sailors (Alfred Blum from Germany and Henri Roumaillac from France), as well as three women.

FABRIS RAISED THE FLAG

The ceremonial opening for the World Masters Championship started with Croatian national anthem performed by klapa Šušur, while 1978 European Champion Minski Fabris raised the Croatian flag.

All gathered were greeted by the regatta director Ivan Kuret, top sailor himself, stated that it is a great honor for him and his club to host the masters sailors and thanked the volunteers for job well done week before at the Finn European Senior and Junior Championship.

Other than sailing, at least at the Masters championship, getting together is as important and many have arrived to the championship with their families to visit our town and enjoy in all that Dalmatia has to offer.



CAMP IN FRONT OF BANOVINA

Steady wind with plenty of knots for sailing and great company was wished to all by Mario Negotić, Head of City of Split's department for sport while greeting all gathered sailors and organizers on behalf of the city mayor Mr. Željka Keruma.

It is interesting to point out that the majority of Finn sailors participating in this regatta are arriving with their campers and sailboat trailers. In order for them to be as close to YC Labud, the host club for this competition, their parking is located at the parking lot on Zvončac. Seeing the number of entries the club asked for additional location. The solution was found in old "Bašta Zvončac" that some time now hasn't been in use and at the moment has three owners however all, without a problem, agreed to allow us to use the space for several days. At present it is being used by the sailors for their tents and campers as the club procured water and electricity to them.

All the boats are located at the plateau of YC Labud and neighboring SC Morнар, that also allowed the sailors their space, so that this sailing elite would have best conditions for sailing and stay at our city.
