9. SPLIT OLYMPIC SAILING WEEK

THIRD DAY OF THE INTERNATIONAL SAILING REGATTA IN THE SPLIT AQUATORIUM FINALISED

# Battle at the top!

Third day of the international sailing regatta for Olympic classes Split Olympic Sailing Week was marked by fantastic sailing conditions. Northern wind of 20 knots and gusts of up to 23 knots, plenty of sunshine and „cheek pinching“ cold enabled the successful conclusion of all planned events.

Fleet of 70 yachtsmen from 12 countries (France, Austria, Hungary, Czech Republic, Ireland, Slovenia, Montenegro, Estonia, Cyprus, Poland, Italy and Croatia) headed out to sea around 10 am and the first start was marked at 11:00 for class 470. After two events they were also the first ones to return to shore.

— We are leading after four events, now we are waiting for the worst results to be discarded but overall we are very happy with our performance – young competitors from Zadar, members of SK Uskok and members of the Croatian Olympic team Enina Ninčević and Romana Župan were very concise.

The first ones after them to finish two events were competitors in class Finn and young member of SK Labud Jospi Olujić is currently leading.

— I am doing well, by the looks of it, I have been training the most this winter – 22 year old joked who, in his first regatta of the season is still in front of our Olympian Ivan Klaković Gašpić. Legendary Bambi, our best skipper in this class, had trouble with his rudder and did not even finish one of the events.

In this class Milan Vujašinović from SK Split is also doing well, this young skipper has only been sailing in Finn for a month and his second place after two days of sailing is a fantastic boost for Milan before his international regattas.

We can also state that everyone was looking at the stern of another Olympian, Tina Mihelić. Labud's skipper recorded all four wins in laser radial in both male and

female categories amongst 17 yachtsmen. Second and third place is held by members of Mornar Toma Stipanović and Stjepan Vuletić.

It is very unpredictable and exciting in laser standard where 22 yachtsmen are competing for the trophy. Details will decide on the winner of the 9th edition of the SOSW regatta.

Kacper Zieminski from Poland is currently in the lead in front of our Olympian Tonči Stipanović from SK Mornar from Split and Daniel Mihelić from SK Labud. All of them are very closely followed by the silver medallist from the London Olympics in 2012 Pavlos Kontides from Cyprus who is currently in fourth place.

Last day of the competition, Sunday, will therefore be a very exciting day – planned start of the first event is at 11:00 and the weather forecast is predicting enough knots to conclude two more events.

MLADEN MAKJANIĆ, ONCE A SUCCESSFUL SKIPPER, NOW AN INTERNATIONAL UMPIRE

# Nuances will decide...

Mladen Makjanić's name is very well known in the world of sailing. He was the first one to win a medal for Croatian sailing, bronze in laser, in this class he won a total of nine national championships and along with the bronze from the world championship he has also won 4th place at the European championship, 3rd place in the Europa cup and a silver medal from the Mediterranean games. He has also won two national championships in Finn and one in cadet class.

For the last 12 years, for 3 mandates, he has been an international umpire and has umpired regattas when our own representatives Tina Mihelić and Tonči Stipanović won their European championships.

This year he returns to the regatta field with the president of the Panel of Umpires Marianne Orvin Middelthon, last year they umpired at the world championship, now they are cooperating at the Split Olympic Sailing Week, and in September they will be umpiring the races in front of the shores of Dublin at the Laser European Championship.

We have to mention that Mladen used to mentor Karlo Kuret, current director of the SOSW regatta, and the sports director



of Labud, host of this international competition.

We asked Mladen to comment on the

third day of this years SOSW:

— I have to say that the competitors are really having a tough time at sea. They were faced with a westerly current, waves of Eastern direction and North to Northeast wind. At times they faced fast wind changes of 20- 30 degrees so it was difficult to control and hard to predict changes, especially for those in the lead.

Makjanić also notes that tomorrow's events will be the deciding factor.

— Nuances will decide the winners, especially in laser standard. Zieminski from Poland is currently in front of our Tonči, Mihelić is following them closely and silver medalist from the London Olympics Kontides from Cyprus is not giving up either. It will be interesting to follow the development of this event on the regatta field while the situation in radial is already resolved. Tina Mihelić successfully sailing towards 1st place, without a single lost event. Also, everything is going well. All events are unveiling correctly, there were no major problems or objections. We only sent out three objections to the competitors – Makjanić summed up all Saturday's events.

## TWO EVENTS ALSO PLANNED FOR THE FOURTH DAY OF THE REGATTA

The weather forecast for Sunday is predicting enough wind for the completion of two planned events. Winds of up to 10 knots are expected as are higher temperatures than today so the competitors will have an easier task than during the cold weather which marked the first two days of sailing.

The start of the first event is planned for 11:00 and nuances will decide the winners.

It will be interesting to see how things will develop in laser standard where four competitors are fighting for first place. Polish yachtsmen Kacper Zieminski is currently in the best position in front of our

skipper Tonči Stipanović. They are closely followed by Daniel Mihelić as well as by Pavlos Kontides from Cyprus, the silver medalist from the London Olympics who is currently in 4th place.

Competitors in finn are also anxiously waiting for the worst scores to be discarded since that will bring some changes to the final placements. This will favour Ivan Kljaković-Gašpić who didn't finish one event because he was experiencing some problems with the rudder. Young Josip Olujić and Milan Vujanović who has only been competing in this class for a month, are both currently in front of him.

There will also be some doubts until the very last second in class 470. Italian crew Simon Košuta Sivitz and Jaš Farnetti are currently battling it out with our girls Enia Ninčević and Romana Župan. Girls currently hold the lead, but on the last day of the 9th international Split Olympic Sailing Week, winners will be decided by nuances...

Only competitor that has secured her position before the final events is Tina Mihelić. In four events in laser radial she recorded four wins. Her name can already be engraved on the trophy.
